BRAZIL AND CUBA TO JOIN FIRST BLOOD OF WAR

Interned German Gunboat Blown Up By Crew Rather Than Surrender.

SEVEN GERMANS ARE KILLED IN EXPLOSION

Thirty-Two Officers and Three Hundred and Twenty Men Are Taken Prisoners as Result of the Explosion Last Night.

Washington, April 7 .- The interned erman gunboat Cormorant, at the Island of Guam, in the Pacific, basbeen blown up. The crew of the Cormorant refused to surrender the boat to the American force which went to take possession of her and destroyed the vessel. Two German officers and men were killed in the explosion.

Twenty officers twelve warrant officers and 320 eristed men were taken

The destruction of the Cormorant took place at eight o'clock last night

Washington time. Internment of the Cormorant at Guam had been the cause of continual conflic and disagreeable incidents between the American navni pilicers in charge of the island and the German crew. On sev eral occasions former German Ambana dor Bernstorff apeal to the State De-partment on behalf of the Cormorant's officers and crew to have vessel trans-ferred to San Francisco. Each time the

Navy Department refused.
The Cormorant was chased into Guam by Japanese warships soon after the declaration of war between Japan and Germany. The ship had exhausted her fuel supply, raiding commerce and was compelled to burn her woodwork struc-ture under which she used to make steam to reach that port.
