



at Bullecourt, Two and a half Miles Beyond Queant. To the South the British Have Forged Well Beyond Queant. The great human nippers which Gen-

eral Haig has forged around the southern end of the Drocourt-Quennt switch line are steadily closing and the rolling up of this important section of the German defensive appears to be a matter of GUILFORD PARK a few days. The line is the hastily improvised barrier drawn up by Field Mar-shall Von Hindenburg to protect Cambrai and Douai, after the Hindenburg line has been smashed by the British The hitter resistance offered by the Germans to the British advance has contered in their defensive at Bullecourt, two and one-half miles west of Queant. To the south the British have forged

well beyond Queant. . The capture of the village was en-trusted to Australians and those hardfighting colonials have almost surround-ed the German stronghold so that its surrender or extinction is expected momentarily. The crushing in of this sa-lient will mean that the German front on the great Lenz coal region will be broken and the entire German line in northern France imperiled. There are many signs that the German realize the menace to them in the alternate sledge hammer blows of the British and French being steadily driven from position aff-er position. News from the western front is not only being suppressed in Berlin, but is being doctored for the consumption of German newspaper read-

ers. Discrepancies between the German and allied official versions are apparent. ly arousing suspicion in some German lines, at least, and the Berlin newspa-pers are being bombarded with ques-tions that their military critics seem to find some difficulty in answering. Aside from France the only fighting


