North Carolina Supplies Seven Thousand Who will Go to Greeneville

ALL IN NATION GET READY FOR MOVEMENT

The New England Guardsmen, Forty Thousand in Number Plan Now to Go to Charlotte, N. C. At Early Date.

Raleigh, N. C., July 25 -- More than 7,000 National Guardsmen were mobilneed in North Carolian today preparatory to being drafted in to the Federal service. One regiment of infantry and two companies of engineers of the North Carolina guard about 1,400 men never were discharged from Federal service

Lorder and Adjutant General Royster said today that the state would send be tween 8,500 and 9,000 men to the camp at Greeneville, S. C., if all units were ordered there: Many recruits are being added to the rolls.

Movement of the troops probably would depend upon when the camp was ready for them, General Royster said.




