



## AMERICAN LEAGUE VETERANS NOT OLD

Since Plank, Crawford and Lajoie are Out of Active Baseball Only a Few Veterans Remain.

New York, Sept. 11.—Since Eddie Plank, Sam Crawford and Nap Lajoie have been counted out of active competition in the American League the veteran class in that organization has沉没ed down to just a few players, none of whom has spent more than thirteen years in the big show.

Thirteen years is a lot of time, but when considered alongside the records of Lajoie, Wagner and a few others of that they fade away.

Not many persons would admit that Terry Turner of the Cleveland Indians is the oldest player in point of playing years now in the American League, but he is. Terry made his advent into the exclusive Johnson circuit in 1904, going from Columbia. For years he was a regular with the old blues, sometimes as an outfielder and sometimes as an infielder. He never was a heavy hitter, but his record would make any ambitious youngster jealous. His best season with the bat was in 1912 when he hit .308.

Leaving Terry, it is discovered that Ty Cobb, Eddie Collins and Clyde Milan are the oldest players. Youngsters, they are considered by a great many persons who see their activities on the field.

Cobb has been a member of Hugh Jennings' Detroit Tigers for twelve years. He never has played with another big league club. Collins has been a big leaguer eleven years. His activities have been confined to Philadelphia and Chicago.

Clyde Milan left Wichita, Kan., ten years ago to take up the business of baseball under Clarke Griffith, and he has enjoyed a most brilliant career.

Other veterans still sojourning in the American League are Jack Barry, Owney Bush, Frank Baker and Tris Speaker. Not a one of those generally recognized in the records as oldtimers is really considered in that light, and with only one or two exceptions, it is probable the entire list will be there for years to come. Cobb, particularly looks

good for at least ten more years if he continues to care for himself as in the past.

### NEGROES PLOTTED HOUSTON RIOTS

Houston, Texas, Sept. 13.—Negro soldiers of the twenty-fourth United States Infantry had planned a riot of bloodshed among the white residents of Houston two days before the deadly outbreak occurred which cost the lives of fifteen Houston citizens August 23, according to inquiry which reported to the city council last night. The report also criticizes Superintendent of Police Brock, for his inability to enforce discipline among the police and declares that "he is not qualified for the position he holds."
