



GIANTS HAVE EDGE IN OUTFIELDING

Outfield of Giants is One of Most Efficient Combinations of Gardeners in the Game.

New York, Sept. 18.—Kauff, Burns and Robertson, or Eichel, Felsch and Jackson form a trio of outfielders that would flatter the heart of most big league managers. There are few combinations in the big show that equal, or even approach the efficiency of these gardeners who will defend the outfield works during the world's series.

Kauff's hitting, Burns' clever fielding, combined with his hitting and Burns' Robertson's slugging give the Giants the predominance in outfielding. If Joe Jackson was at the height of hitting he could reach a different result. However, Kauff is a natural amount of hammering in the coming big games.

George Burns is one of the game's greatest outfielders. If there is a man in the National League who compares favorably with Ty Cobb, Ty Spink and the clever other outfielders in the American League it is the Giants' star fielder. Burns, besides being a 100 batsman and a fielder over whom it is almost impossible to drive a hit, is the stabilizing player in the National League. He does his work in a slump. His work makes a certain point each year and stays there. He is a remarkably fast thinker. Rival National leaguers will attest to the numerous plays that he has victimized them with.

Benny Kauff reached the National League, proclaimed as a man who would rival Ty Cobb. Benny didn't claim it himself, although he was generally credited with having done so. But press agenting got him a lot of publicity that hurt him dreadfully. He has been with the Giants. Gradually he has shaken this off until he stands now as a great National League star, made in the National League by McGraw's methods. Benny's hitting, always dangerous, is even more so now, for he has learned to wait for the good balls. His hitting will be the predominant factor in the Giants' success.

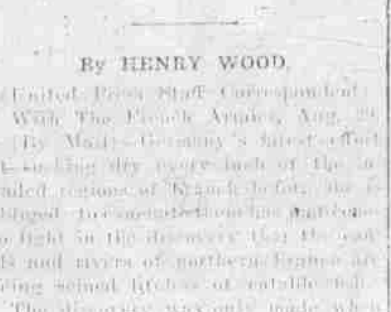
SOME INTERESTING DATA ON WHEAT

When the present prices of wheat are considered, many farmers should take up the work if for no other reason than to supply a sufficient amount of flour for home use. Many growers can greatly increase the average yield as reported hereby a little more care and preparation of the soil, selecting the seed, fertilizing and sowing same.

Another matter of interest in the reports received is the fact that a number of farmers in the central plains report yields of from fifteen to thirty bushel per acre. With the present high prices, it is seen that wheat may be grown profitably even in the eastern sections of the state. To deal with wheat, however, several important things should be considered, such as the proper preparation of the soil, sowing so as to combat the Hessian Fly, and yet so that the wheat will have a good start before the frosts come on. The wheat seed also should be treated for smut if it contains this disease. Proper fertilization should also be attended to; and when these things are carefully considered, profitable yields are well assured. 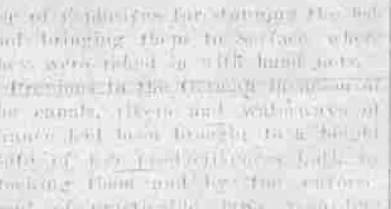

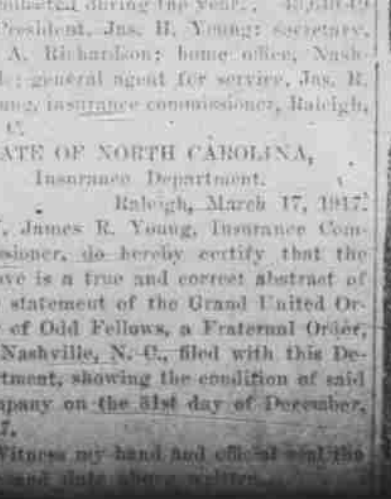
