gressmen pledged to support the dry amendment when it comes to a vote. Careful canvasses have made this known, league leaders say, within a very few votes.

Success for the resolution which will submit the question to the several states is assured, according to these officials, by an overwhelming vote. Only the House remains to be won, the Senate having approved the measure last session.

Prominent among the nationally known men who will address the 2,000 delegates are Senators Sheppard of Texas, and Borah, of Idaho; and Reps. Barkley, Ky.; Webb, N. C.; Fess, O.; and William Jennings Bryan.

There will be jubiliations over the capture of these states since the last convention, in July 1916; Michigan, Montana, Indiana, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Nebraska and New Mexico. The District of Columbia also was voted dry by Congress.

Reverses were met in Iowa, where the voters rejected a dry constitutional amendment, although the dry statute remains in effect; and in Ohio, by so close a vote that a contest is expected.

Winning of Ohio and one or two more eastern industrial states is regarded as essential to prohibition strategy. Even if congress submits the dry resolution, it will be unless its present form is amended—in such shape that it must be approved by three-fourths of all the states within six years.

Any 13 of the states could necessitate making the fight all over again.
