NASH WHITE MEN WILL GO MONDAY

Forty Men Will Report at Nashville Monday to Entrain for Camp Forty-five white registrants of Nash county have been called by the Nash county board to present themselves at Nashville, on Monday, July 22, at 10 o'clock in the morning, to receive entrainment instructions prior to the entrainment of 40 white men from this number at 11:30 a.m. on the same day. The men will go to Camp Hancock, at Augusta, Ga.

Every man of the 45 is urged to appear promptly on Monday morning, so as not to delay the entrainment. Forty men will be called to insure the securing of the desired number. As the entrainment will take place Monday an hour and a half after reporting time, this makes it more highly important that all men called for this movement should be at the board's headquarters at 10 o'clock sharp.

The next movement from Nash will be on July 29, when a large movement of colored Class 1 men will entrain for Camp Greene, at Charlotte. Washington, July 18.-Protection for the wheat farmer against arbitrary grading of his wheat and non-competitive buying is provided for in the food administration's wheat and flour control plan for the 1918 crop announced today.

INDIANS DOING RED CROSS WORK

Indian Women and Children Doing Great Work in Aiding Red Cross Washington, July 18.-The deeds of Indians who have enlisted in large numbers in the military service are hardly more inspiring than those of the women and children left behind. This is a partial account of the answer made by the people on the reservations when the "Great White Feather" in Washington called to the tribes and races inhabiting this land of freedom to rise in its defense.

Reports received by Colo. Sells, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, from about one-third of the Indian reservations, indicate a total Red Cross membership of 4 close to 20,000 contributions in money amounting to more than \$20,000 and further donations of thousands of hospital garments and knitted articles. That is not a full measure of the Red Man's generosity; however, for the reservations do not house many Indians, including the more wealthy, whose charitable activities are listed with the general population.

Reporting to methods of the white man to raise money, the Omaha tribe recently held an auction for the Red Cross which netted \$2,000, including \$200 for a prize goat. The boys of a school in the northwest gathered 2,000 pounds of sphagnum moss for surgical absorbent pads. Some 400 Christmas boxes were reported, which is incomplete, as nearly all of the 120 boarding schools have service flags with white stars ranging in number from a few to two hundred, and the pupils of these schools are very mindful of their soldier representatives. One of the larger schools reported a Student's Friendship War Fund, with \$700 on hand and twelve war savings societies. This school in four weeks bought 1,000 shirt stamps and 14 Baby Bumps.

On a small reservation far north, where the winters are long and severe and the Indians must struggle for the necessities of life, more than one dollar per capita for every adult was paid in cash for the Red Cross and other war relief purposes. In the Southwest where the parched desert gives scant returns and sheep-raising is the chief means of support, many of the Indians have each produced a fleece of wool for the Red Cross and the Superintendent plus the experiment of spinning this wool and knitting it into sock-creepers, etc., by the Indian women.

In a Montana district where the Indians are nearly all full-bloods they voluntarily held meetings and each one who has a growing wheat crop promised to donate one sack of wheat for war relief work. On another reservation where the Indians are very poor and have little ready money, they donated an abundance of handsome bead work and other curios to be sold for the Red Cross.

One of the smaller schools in Oklahoma reported a Junior Red Cross membership of 176 members, being the total enrollment of the school. The superintendent of one of the boarding schools for girls of the Five Civilized Tribes in Oklahoma declared the girls are deeply interested in all war work and responded readily to request for additional garments. The very small girls knit up the socks, ever into refugee caps, nightgowns, etc. Also they utilize the scraps from the hospital garments making quilt blocks. Larger scraps are used for small underclothes for the refugees. Girl-wipers have been cut by the hand.

GERMANS DEPICT AN AIR RAID ON NEW YORK ROOF GARDEN

Amsterdam, July 18.-A cartoon in the latest issue of the German comic paper Jugend pictures a German airplane in New York. The scene is a New York roof garden, from which the plane is ablaze with bombs, shrapnel and fighting planes. An American "soldier" is shown cowering in a hole, his rocky-clad wife, who is said to be contributing in terms of money, the appropriation in the "sky." He reassures her by saying soothingly: "Well, my dear, you have always been known as having the latest Parisian notions. Now you've got them!"

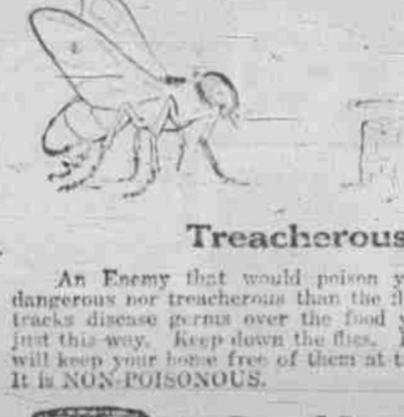

War Recipes!

LIMA BEANS

For No. 2 cans or put for hot beans. Select riding and tender lima or butter beans, grade them all in the dish, blanch from 2 to 1 1/2 minutes, and pack can by to within one half inch of top. Fill can of jar with brine (1 gallon of water and one-half cup salt). Reheat on 10 minutes and process 1 hour on first day. Remove from canner and set aside for 24 hours. After the water is boiling in canner on the second day place the cans therein for a second processing or boiling of 1 hour in length; remove set aside for 24 hours and process 1 hour on the third day. When canning butter beans, in glass use a pint jar and process 1 hour and 25 minutes each of the three days.
