**Big Locomotive Goes
Through Roundhouse**

One of the big Chicago and North-western freight locomotives, No. 2491, yesterday became restless, and of its own accord ploughed its way through the end of the roundhouse, taking the door and windows along with it. The giant engine's wheels are now imbedded several inches in the surface of Mother Earth, and is in the same predicament as a Ford in a two-foot mudhole. The tender did not leave the track.

Officials at the roundhouse this morning stated that a leaking throttle caused the big locomotive to creep out of its stall and seek fresh air on the exterior of its home. It seems no one was nearby at the time. When the engine was found outside the roundhouse, employees felt something like the elephant trainer who returned to find Jumbo broken from his moorings and coming free on the circus lot. It was a big proposition to get him back again.

However, work has been started toward laying a track alongside the stranded monster, so that the wrecking crane can appear on the scene, pick up the wayward locomotive and place it safely back in its fold. It was expected the wrecking crew would have the engine on the track again by tonight.

As is known, the Atlantic Coast Line is sending the borrowed C. and N. W. locomotives back home, nearly all of the ten big engines having departed for the North. Thus No. 2491 may have gotten homesick, and in puncturing the roundhouse wall was expressing a desire to get back home. The intention was good, but the aim was bad.

HOLDING BOLSHIEVICKY NAVAL OFFICERS TO BE EXCHANGED

London, June 10.—British Naval authorities are holding at Helsingfors the Bolshevik "Admiral" Raskelinkoff, to exchange him and his aid-camp for twenty-two British sailors who have been prisoners in Russia for some time. Raskelinkoff was captured when a Russian destroyer was taken by the British while engaged in laying mines in the Baltic.

When the British first proposed his exchange for twenty-two sailors, the Bolshevik demurred on the ground that the exchange was not fair but the Admirals were interfered and got them to make the exchange.
