THE RATIFICATION TREATY IMPOSSIBLE DURING THIS MONTH

Senate Leaders Admit Action Impossible Before League's First Meeting

SENATOR SIMMONS OFFERS RESERVATION

Democrats Prone to Defer Action Until After Election Minority Leader on Thursday — Compromise Negotiations Gain Impetus

Washington, Jan. 12.—Probability of final Senate act on the peace treaty by January 16 when the League of Nations council will assemble in Paris is regarded as impossible according to statements by leading democrats in republicans today. Not before next week is any action possible, and democratic leaders declared that they would be satisfied if ratification was another month.

White negotiations toward a compromise gained new impetus today, it was said that some democrats were disposed to defer action until after the parliamentary session next Thursday when a minority leader will be elected.

FARMERS UNION IN DISTRICT MEETING

Officials and Representatives from Eastern Counties Meet in City.

With prominent officials including President R. W. H. Stone, of Greenville, W. B. Gibson, chairman of the state executive committee of Asheville, and E. C. Harris, state senator of Greensboro, in attendance, a district meeting of the Farmers Union, at which local officers from eight of ten eastern counties are expected to be present, is being held at the Rock Hotel in this city today.

The meeting, which is to be opened at 10 a.m., is one of four which are being held in various sections of the state. With the initial meetings held today, similar sessions will be held in Raleigh, Charlotte, and Winston-Salem at early dates in the future. The visiting local officers will remain in session during the afternoon while the state officials hint that their visit to the city may be prolonged until tomorrow.

According to avowed intentions the purpose of the meeting here is to review and coordinate the work of the Farmers Union throughout the state. Just what "the work" means is a matter of conjecture as one of the speakers admitted that the territory's union and resolution act would come up for lively discussion.

Members of Foreign Legion Join French Organization

New Year, Jan. 13.—American volunteers who served in the Spahis corps, the foreign legion or the Lafayette Escadrille are to be accepted as associate members in the federation of French veterans of the great war, it was announced here today at the New York headquarters by Charles Bourges, the general-secretary.

The organization, formed to "reunite a spirit of loyalty to the United States and attachment to France," will extend its activity, it is said, to Canada and Mexico. Elie Norton of the Norton-Harjes-Ambulance and R. Howard Gammie of the American field service, have been designated by the federation's executive committee to pass upon applications for associate and honorary membership.

WATER FAMINE IN NORFOLK STILL ON

Officials Adopt Every Means of Increasing City's Meager Supply

Norfolk, Va., Jan. 13.—City officials are today making every effort possible to increase the city's meager supply of drinking water. Pipe has been ordered to connect the Norfolk and Portsmouth systems and plans will be made for acquiring a new supply from Burr Mills and Lake Phillips, some distance from Norfolk. In the meantime water is being zealously hoarded and reduced pressure makes it impossible to secure a supply above the ground floors of residence and business houses.

A supply sufficient for drinking purposes was brought in here today in tank cars and more is en route.
