

GERMANY ALLOWED TO TRY ACCUSED PERSONS IN HER OWN TRIBUNALS

Allied Terms for Trial of Condemned Criminals Much Modified

London, Feb. 17.—Germany has been informed that the allied powers have modified their terms for the trial of condemned criminals. The allied powers have agreed to allow Germany to try the accused persons in her own tribunals, provided that the trial is held in public and that the accused persons are given the opportunity to defend themselves.
