

HAPPINESS FOR THE FRENCH KIDDIES

American Children Responsible for Happiness of the French Youngsters

Paris, April 6.—American children have brought happiness and laughter into the lives of their little brothers and sisters in France. The pennies and dimes which they might have spent for candy and sweetmeats have enabled the Junior Red Cross to give to the children of France, in those same playgrounds and innumerable games.

All the games and recreations which form so much part of the lives of their little kinfolk in America are taught the French boys and girls.

As proof of the appreciation of the generosity of America's help, the French themselves have now raised a fund almost equal to that contributed by the children of the United States and are planning to establish a playground of the American type in every important district of France.

Several of the playgrounds established by the Americans are in Paris and are directed by recreation experts from the United States. The average French child, especially the adolescent child born during or immediately after the war, is not inclined to play with

but robust energy and that spirit of team work necessary to its mental, physical and moral development. Moreover, games like baseball and basketball are not common in France as in America. They must be taught.

One of the principal tasks of the American instructors is to teach the French child a spirit of fair play and unselfishness.

The French child is an individualist, playing alone and guarding jealously his or her toy. He does not fraternize or make friends among the children of the neighborhood. As a result he becomes selfish and one-sided. The Americans are trying to show the French children the happiness that comes from community play and teamwork. They are introducing group games to overcome the selfishness and inordinate qualities of fairness, good nature and gallantry.

Wadsworth, Ohio, April 6.—William H. Sr., and Henry Burns, eighty-eight years of age, who claim the distinction of being the oldest living twins in the United States and who recently celebrated their 88th birthday here after being residents of this village for almost sixty years, give the following recipe for longevity:

Starting in business in 1861 in a general store, William was on the job every day, except for a recessional dinner, until December 5, 1918, when fire destroyed the establishment.

Henry was his clerk only at first, then his partner, and then himself in business for himself, building a grocery in 1865. In this business Henry was established a regular for work, being on the job continuously until 1921 when fire "retired him."

Since quitting the store and until the twins have devoted their time to their extensive and thriving here, visiting their sons almost daily and helping in the chores and other odd jobs and jobs.

Born in Hanover, Germany, February 1, 1834, the Burns brothers came to America at the age of eighteen years. Both were married and have families.

Chicago, April 6.—President Harding has given his personal endorsement to the movement inaugurated by the American Home Bureau for launching the Better Homes week to be observed next October as an annual event.

"It gives me special pleasure," writes President Harding in reading a letter from Wallace B. Wray, "to accept my endorsement and approval of the 'Better Homes week.' It may be true, but it is exceedingly true that the home is the cornerstone of our civilization. Better homes, more attractive homes, homes whose members will find true refreshment and real inspiration to increased effort for education and culture—such homes are the ones which assure greatest stability to our institutions, greatest security to our society. I cannot but feel that the effort you are making for one which deserves a wider protection and I would be glad if your example might promptly be an inspiration to a nationwide enterprise of the same kind."


