A Proclamation. WHEREAS by an act of the Congress of the United States paffed the twenty feventh day of February latt, entitled " An act further to fulpend the commercial intercourte hetween the United States and France and the dependencies thereof," it is enacted, Inst at any time after the paffing of the faid act, it that be lawful for the Prelident of the United States, by his order, to remit and dit. continue for the time being, whene ver he fiall deem it extedient and for the interest of the United States, al or any of the reffraints and prohibitions impated by the faid of, in refpect to the territories of the Erench Republic, or to any flond, porter place belonging to the faid Republic, with which in his opinion a commercial intercourfe may be fifely renewed and to make Proclamation there of accordingly : and it is also thereby fur ther enacted, That the whole of the ifland of Hilpaniola hall, for the purpoles of the faid act be confidered as a dependence of the French Republic.
