

Extract of a letter from New-Orleans, dated November 9.

General Wilkinson is now here, and the French Prefect is to receive investiture of the province to-morrow in form preparatory to the delivery to the United States. The whole proceeding is conducted with the concurrence of Gen. Wilkinson."

New-York, December 26.

The ship Independence, captain Fleming, arrived at this port yesterday in 37 days from Londonderry.—She sailed on the 17th of November, but brings no newspapers. By verbal intelligence we learn that the disturbances in Ireland had entirely ceased; and numbers who had formerly been among the malcontents were joining the ranks for the purpose of defending their country against the French invasion, which was hourly expected. The news of the sailing of the Brest fleet had not reached Londonderry when captain Fleming sailed.
