 "We are happy to learn (says a late Boston Gazette) that the passengers and crew of the ship Jupiter, who embarked on board the long boat, were fell in with by several fishing schooners soon after they parted with the yawl; and happily rescued them from their perilous situation. Gilbert J. F. Smiffaer, one of the passengers, arrived in town yesterday from Marthalead, where he was brought by a vessel, who received him from one of the fishing boats. He informs that the people, preserved with him were all in health, and distributed among the several fishing vessels on the banks.

The ship Mohawk, Captain Peck, of New-Heaven, was captured on the 7th April, on his passage from Martinique, by the British ship of war Heures, Capt. Younghusband, under Danth colours, and carried into Tortola. The pretence for capture, as given by Captain Peck in his protest, (a copy of which is in our possession) was that "War had broken out between England and America and that 150,000 men had been sent against the latter!" Extract of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina, passed in the year 1804.

AND be it further enacted that the Commissioners of Smithville shall order and direct that every person or persons, possessors or owners of any Lot or Lots in said town, shall on or before the first day of July next, clean all and every such Lot and Lots by them possessed or held, of all Trees except Fruit Trees, and such as are planted or trimmed up and intended to be kept for shade or ornament—underwood, brushy and high weeds growing, standing, or being on said Lots; and see that the same be cleared from such weeds and brush, on or before the 1st day of July, in each and every year, and thereafter be kept clear. And in case of neglect or refusal, the Commissioners are hereby empowered to have the same done, at the expense of the owners or possessors of said Lots, for which their property shall be liable.
