

BY THE PRESIDENT OF The United States of America, A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS, information has been received that a num-ber of individuals, who have deserted from the army of the United States, have become sensible of their offences, and are desirous of returning to their duty :

A full pardon is hereby granted and proclaimed to each and all such individuals as shall, within four months from the date hereof, surrender hemselves to the commanding officer of any military post within the United States or the territories thereof

In testimony whereof, I have caused the seal L.S. of the United States to be affixed to these presents, and signed the same with my hand.

Done at the City of Washington, the eighth day of October, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and of the Independence of the United States, the thirtyseventh.

EXCHANGE OF OLD SIX PER CENT. AND DEFERRED STOCKS.

PURSUANT to the act of Congress, entitled " An act authorising a subscription for the old six percent. & deferred stocks, and providing for the exchange of the same," passed on the 6th day of July, 1812, books will be opened on the first day of October next, at the T casury, and at the several Loan Offices, and will continue open till the 17th day of March next, for receiving subscriptions of the old six per cent and deferred stocks, in the manner prescribed by the said act.
