THE President of the United States, on the 17th of June, 1814, issued his Proclamation, pardoning all deserters who will deliver themselves up to any officer of the United States Army within three months from the date thereof.

Deserted from Captain Ion's Company of Artillery.

John Cain, born at Winsthaven, state of Massachusetts; about 5 feet 10 inches high, black eyes and hair, fair complexion. Deserted from Castle Pinckney about the 12th July, 1812.

John Middleton, born in North Carolina, aged 27 years, 5 feet 7 inches high, dark complexion, light eyes and black hair, two of his front teeth out, and by profession a farmer. Deserted from Marion district S. C. on the 3d September, 1812.

Levi Morgan, born in Fairfield District, S. Carolina, 44 years of age, 6 feet high, dark complexion, dark hair and dark eyes; by profession a farmer. Deserted the 13th August, 1812.
