. THE CIRCASSIAN EXODUS.

One of the most remarkable events of this eventful era is the defeat of the Circassians by the Russians, and the flight of the entire nation into Turkish territory. The London Times furnishes some interesting particulars of this exodus, before quoting Siddle J B, co C 3 cav which it will be appropriate to refer briefly to the history of the Circassians, who have been some times represented as the "handsomest, bravest and

noblest of mankind." Circassia became subject to the Tartar Kahns of the Crimea in the 15th century. From this servitude, the Circassians released themselves in the 16th century, by the aid of Ivan I., of Russia, who had married a Carcassian princess. At a later period, the Circassians acknowledged the Sultan as head of their faith, but do not appear to have been politically subject to Turkey except as an ally in making forays on the Russian frontier. When Russia extorted the treaty of Adrianople from the Turks (1829) the Sultan ceded Circassia to Russia, but the Cirs cassians refused to recognize the cession. Their resistance to the Russian claim of sovereignty is the cause of the war which has recently terminated in the capitulation of Vardar, the last of the Circassian strongholds, and the consequent submission of Turney L, co K 4 all the tribes. A Circassian deputation arrived in Tharrington A, co F 8 Constantinople in 1856, and presented to the Otto- Thorp Capt, co A 47 man Port an address from the Circassian chiefs, pro- Thornburg Lt, co C 28 testing against the invasion of the "accursed Muscovite," and asking "to be placed forever under the majestic shadow of the imperial throne of the Sultan." The "sick man" could not render any assistance, and at last the valiant people who for so long a period resolutely maintained an unequal struggle with the whole force of the Russian Empire have been compelled to succomb to the "accursed Musco-

Three hundred thousand "immigrants"-men. women and children-were, a short time since, hovering on the Circassian coast of the Euxine and catching at every opportunity to reach Trebizond .-They seemed to prefer any miseries to remaining under the sway of their Muscovite conquerors. They were congregated in places on the seaboard, where there was no provision whatever for their shelter or substance. Every little coasting vessel was seized upon as a means of conveyance to Trebizond, and those who survived the sea passage were exposed to the perils of disease and famine at Trebibond, where the small pox and typhus fever were raging among the immigrants and native population

alike. The Turkish Government has made energetic efforts to relieve the sufferings of the Carcassians .-The expense involved in the measures adopted is estimated at not less than one million pounds sterling. The management of the Circassians will be an enormous expense to the Turks, and they deserve credit for taking it up at once so heartily .-The Sultan himself contributed £50,000 from his -privy purse.

It is asserted that the Russians have done everys thing they could to conciliate these tribes. But we know the worth and meaning of these expressions by the example of Poland; and it is no wonder if it is generally believed that the Russians have in effect driven the people away with the hope of colonizing the place with the Cossack element. Whatever be the truth, it is a cruel story of a simple and brave nation driven out of their homes to make room for the merciless advance of a military organization .-Perhaps it was impossible for a small and fanatical Mahomedan tribe to maintain themselves, even in mountain fastnesses, against a vast Empire as fanatical as themselves for another religion.
