Newbern and Norfolk



STEAM BOAT LINE.

THE Steam-Boat NORFOLK, intended to ply between Newbern and Elizabeth City, on Pasquotank river, will commence her run from Newbern, on Monday next. The size and equipment of the Norfolk, the power of her engine in the plan of Messrs. Bolton & Watt, and the elegant style of her cabins and furniture, in an eminent degree, combine safety and convenience, and will ensure to her passengers all the advantages of the most speedy, safe and pleasant mode of travelling. Stages to correspond with the departure of the Norfolk, will run from Fayetteville to Newbern, and from Elizabeth City to Norfolk, twice a week; and the arrival of the passengers at Norfolk, will be so regulated as to admit their early departure in the Steam Boat Virginia, for Baltimore. The fare of passengers will be fifteen dollars from Newbern to Elizabeth City. Carriages and horses will be carried on deck at moderate charges. The Norfolk will leave Newbern Wednesday mornings, and arrive at Elizabeth City, on same evening; leave Elizabeth City, Thursday morning, and arrive at Newbern same evening; leave Newbern Saturday morning, arrive at Elizabeth City same evening; leave Elizabeth City, Monday morning, and arrive at Newbern same evening, until further notice. The distance from Fayetteville to Newbern, 120 miles; from Newbern to Elizabeth City, 160 miles; from Elizabeth City to Norfolk, 40 miles; making a distance of 320 miles; the boat is performed from Fayetteville to Norfolk, in four days.
