Our advices from Fredericksburg are to noon yesterday. The intelligence from that quarter is of high= ly important and interesting character, but most of it not proper for present publication. There has been no cannonading on either side since Monday night, but the enemy has been busy putting cannon into position on the Stafford Hills, opposite the town and for a mile above. Nothing is yet positively known of the enemy's strength, but from observations made on Tuesday night, and information from other sources, deemed anthentic, nearly the whole Abolition army is believed to be concentrated at that point.
