BURNSIDE'S DEMAND FOR THE SURRENDER OF FREDERICKSBURG—THE MAYOR'S REPLY, ETC.

The following is a condensed account of the correspondence between Gen. Sumner and the Mayor of Fredericksburg:

General Patrick crossed the river on Friday, the 21st instant, under flag of truce, with a communication from Sumner to Mayor Slaughter, stating that under cover of the houses of the city shots had been fired upon troops of his command.

The Mayor replied that the firing of shots upon his troops on Northern suburbs was an act of the military for which the citizens were not responsible.
