Follow-citizens, no alternative is left you but victory, or subjugation, slavery and the utter ruin of yourselves, your families and your country. The victory is within your reach. You need but stretch forth your hands to grasp it.

Given under my hand, and the Seal of the Confederate States, at Richmond, this 15th day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.
