THE SITUATION AT CHATTANOOGA.

"P. W. A." of the Savannah Republican, writing from Lookout Mountain, on the 14th, says: The two armies confront each other still, though, in other respects, some interesting changes have occurred since the date of my last letter from this place...

It is believed also that Rosecrans has sent his horses to the rear, probably to points on the railroad where they will be convenient for forage, as none have been seen about Chattanooga for the last few days.

It is not probable, however, that the enemy will abandon the lower or river road without making a strong effort to keep it open. The difficulty of procuring supplies is already serious enough.

It is reported that a provision train arrived night before last, and that for some days previous the Federal army had been put upon shorter rations than any Confederate army in the field has ever been known to.
