THE STALLFEDERATE SYSTEM. It seems to be very difficut, if not impossible, to obtain from official sources all the facts in relation to this system, now in full blast under Gov. Varce. Col. Russ, who denounced this system two years ago before the people of Wake. and who is as much opposed to it under one floverpor as another, has approached three of Gov. Vance's subordinates on the subject, with the view of obtaining full and accurate official information; and he informs us that though he was treated politely, yet he has been unable, with the meagre information given him to trace and expose this monstrous abuse as it should be. As little as possible of their doings for the public eye, seems to be the instructions of Gov. Vance. to his subordinates. But we call on the people to mark the fact, and to bear in mind, while thousands of women and children have not had a bite of meat for months, and are suffering even for bread, that the shade officers who surround tiov. Vance are not only allowed their salaries, but they are permitted to buy their four, and bacon, and corn meal, and sugar, and coffee, and rice, and candles and the like at very low government prices, and some of them, it is said, are allowed to charge for room rent in their own houses, and their horses, used by them for their own private purposes, are fed by the State. This abuse was stopped by Gov. Vance when he came into office, at our earnest suggestion, and as iong as he respected our advice the system was not revived ; but about the time he began to fall fully into the arms of the Destructives he revived it, and it is now going on with increased volumo. The protence is that this system is in accordance with the Army Regulations of the Confederates States; but this is not true, for Congress has prohibited even war-worn Colouels from purchasing at goverment, rates, and they are required to go up with their men and draw a private's rations. Only think of it, such officers as Speer, and Jordan, and Faribault, and Faison, and Clarke, and others going up to draw their rations as privates, while Governor Vance's shade officers, who have never smelt pow der, are allowed to purchase everything they want not only for themselves but for their families! Will Gov Vance explain these things to the people ! In our next we shall take up this subject more at length and thoroughly expose these abuses -It is the opinion of many intelligent Conserva-tives, who have had good opportunities to observe and ascertain the facts, that the administration of Gov. Vance is the most corrupt and extravagapt in the Confederate States For our part. we fear there is ground for this opinion. There is certainly much room for the hand of reform .--Standard.
