Later from the North. Petersburg, July 6.—The Chronicle of the 3d contains a special dispatch from Kinross Mountain of the 27th, which says a severe attack was made this morning by selected portions of the 4th, 2d and Logan's corps, on the enemy's centre, right and left.

Operations in gold, on the 30th, were extremely wild. Prices ranged between 240 and 290. Lincoln in his letter accepting the nomination says the Government will be sustained in its action in relation to the French in Mexico.

From Petersburg. Petersburg, July 4, 3 p. m.—The enemy are still in our front at all points of the old line, though doubtless some of their forces have been sent away, probably to the North side of the Appomattox and James river or Washington city.

From Georgia. Chattahoochee, July 5.—There has been very little skirmishing to day. The enemy is cautiously feeling his way. Yesterday burnt the paper mill at Rossville. A Yankee Major and ten privates were brought in this evening.

From Mississippi. Jackson, Miss, via Mobile, July 7.—The enemy estimated at 4,000 occupied this place till 4 m., when they evacuated it, moving back on the Clinton road. Our forces are in front and on their flank.

Meeting of the Press Association. Macon, July 6.—The Board of Directors of the Press Association met to-day and transacted considerable business. Arrangements have been made to secure the transmission of reports when interruption exists on the regular lines and otherwise, to facilitate the general objects of the Association.

From Richmond. Richmond, July 7.—It is reported that nine hundred Yankees were surprised and captured at Martinburg last Sunday; also four pieces of cannon and stores, including extensive preparations for the fourth of July dinner.

From the Mississippi and Beyond.

CLINTON, LA. VIA MOBILE, July 7th.—The steamer Jago, bound with cotton, was captured and burned by our troops in the Atchafalaya River.

The card of Mayor Harrison and accompanying certificate effectually explodes the reports that have been rife for a few days past relative to Mr. Betts, one of the city police.

On Friday, Schofield's corps, consisting of about three regiments of cavalry, and ten thousand infantry, advanced on our left, with the intention probably of driving it back, and flanking our main army, and at the same time getting possession of the Turner Ferry road.

On Saturday morning our troops withdrew about three miles in good order to a high range of hills about two miles beyond the Chattahoochee. These hills have been well fortified by breast works and rifle pits.

Our troops appear to be in the best of spirits, and have every confidence in their commanders. The State militia—the much abused portion of our defenders—it is said stood well on Friday and fought as bravely and cool as the regulars.

It was rumored that Gen. Johnston had determined that the left should retreat no further, and that if the enemy persisted in his advance in that section that a battle would take place.

Up to nine o'clock Saturday morning, the cannonading along the entire line was very heavy. During the remainder of the day scarcely a gun was heard.
