AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED AN ACT TO INCREASE THE EFFICIENCY OF THE HOME GUARD ORGANIZATION.—RATIFIED THE 7TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1865.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina, that the Governor...

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That the Governor may, in the manner herein provided, call into the service...

Section 3. Be it further enacted, That in addition to the provisions mentioned in the second section of an Act...

Section 4. Be it further enacted, That all laws and clauses of laws existing in conflict with this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Be it further enacted, That this act shall be in force from and after its ratification.

GENERAL ORDER. No. 1. ENROLLING OFFICERS IN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA will make diligent enquiry in their respective counties for the names, &c., of all...

For the information of all persons concerned, we publish the following instructions, with the hope that they will be strictly obeyed.

No officer, or agent, shall impress the necessary supplies which any person may have for the consumption of himself, his family, employees, slaves, or to carry on his ordinary mechanical, manufacturing or agricultural employments.

The next meeting of the Board will be held in the Senate Chamber, in the City of Raleigh, on Monday, the 23d day of April next, unless sooner changed.

Conscription Office. Raleigh, N. C. Feb. 17th 1865. The attention of Enrolling officers is called to the following General Order from Headquarters of the Confederate States:

General Order No. 1. In entering upon the campaign about to open, the General in Chief feels assured that the soldiers who have as yet been under arms will be able to sustain the hardships and dangers of the war, without the necessity of responding to the calls of honor and duty.

Those who have deserted after having been once pardoned for the same offence, and those who shall desert, or absent themselves without authority after the publication of this order, are excluded from its benefits.

Enrolling Officers will make every effort to give publicity to this important order, and will urge all good citizens of their respective counties to aid them in rendering it as effectual as possible.

By order of the Commandant: E. J. HARDING, Adjutant. Papers throughout the State except 10th Congressional District copy, Dailies 3 times and Weekly's twice.

SOLDIERS' CLAIMS. THE UNDERSIGNED HAVING BEEN APPOINTED Commissioner to investigate, collect and distribute Claims of Deceased Soldiers, gives notice that after the 30th inst., he will be prepared to furnish the blanks whereby the wives, children, executors or administrators of deceased soldiers may have their claims placed in proper form to be filed in the Auditor's office in Richmond, and will use every effort in his power to have the same properly paid.

Persons applying for blanks must forward a 20 cent postage stamp (or two 10 cent bills) to prepay the postage on the same.
