From the National Intelligencer I creading the "Circular" of the Hon. Lewis Williams, member of the House of Representatives of the United States, Iron. North Carolling, to his constituents, in the Rilligh Minerva, my attention was arrested by the follows ing extraordinary and enormous statement, which is indeed the more strike g, by the apparent candour that marks some other parts of

the Circular. Mr. W. says: "Our army is at present unnecessarily large and intolerably expensive. By a report from the Secretary of War, it appears that, if the army were full, it would consert at twelve thousand six hundred and fifty-six fficers, non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates .-This would give us something more than four men to each officer, non-commissioned officer, and musician. In the same report, it is stated I do Gun and Rifle Locks. that the number of men actually in service is upward of 5000 only; so that we have little more than 2 men for each officer, non-commissioned a) Dozen Spades and Shoofficer & musician. It may be asked, whether there is an army in the world where the dis-Cas. s & Cut, Pit, & Handproportion between officers and men is so great, so enormous? The staff, particularly, is said, 2 de Drawing and Cutting by persons having experience in military at fairs, to be large enough for an army of fifty. thousand men. Some have gone so lar as to say it is large enough for a hundred thousand.
