Domestic. NASHVILLE, June 12, 1819. THE PRESIDENT. The citizens of Nashville, being apprised of the approach of the President to this place, convened and appointed as their committee to enter into and make suitable arrangements for his reception.

The citizens having learned thro' the committee that the President had reached the residence of Gen. Jackson, and that he would dine with them on Wednesday last, set out that day to meet and conduct him to this place. They met him four miles from town accompanied by Maj Gen. Jackson and suit and Brevet Maj. Gen. Gaines. Three miles from town he was received by a large collection of the Tennessee Volunteers, armed and dressed as they were when they were in the several campaigns in which they had been engaged. They were formed in line on each side of the road waiting the approach of the President: as soon as he arrived at the head of the column, coils, Williamson and Phillips advanced and addressed him in the name of the Volunteers.

Arriving at the margin of the town the Masons with a band of music in their front, received and conducted him to the Mayor's house, which had been politely offered for his reception, whether the whole procession moved, arriving at his quarters, he was met by John R. Eaton, esq. who in behalf of the citizens of this place tendered him their welcome in the following address:

SIR,—The citizens of Nashville, and its vicinity, greet your arrival, and tender you their best wishes. Retired from their Atlantic brethren, they but survey at a distance that political machinery which guides and controls the destiny of our best republic; Yes they are deeply alive to the best interests of their country, and with proud pleasure welcome the arrival of their Chief Magistrate, whose constant care has been to move by the line of the constitution, holding steadily in view those principles which protect and secure the general interest. We admire that devotion to the prosperity of our rising republic which has characterized you through life, and with pleasure bear in recollection that every part of our country seems alike to share your protection and care.
