From the R chmond Enquirer. " THE DELIVERER."

Flatterers and even friends had conferred on A exander the title of Deliverer-they have p a sed him as the friend of liberal principles, and of the human race. He has at last unmasked himself. His denunciation of the principles of the Spanish R volution must meet "the most forcible reprobation" of all liberal statesmen. What! will any liberal man dare to deny the light of a people, like those of Spain, to reform their mise able constitution? If a king violates all the o the which he has sworn to his people; if he destroys the constitution, & re-establishes the Inquisition; if he banishes the best men, & employs the worst; if the people see no prospect of redemption, but by their own exertions, shall it be said that they are guilty of a "crime that is. to be disavowed," of a " bad example that is to be exterminated," when they but assert a pertion of their rights ?- Is the destruction of the inquisition "deplorable"? Is the limitation of those arbitrary powers, which a monarch has abused to the detriment of his people ? Or must the people meanly crouch at the feet of the despot, pray him to yield up a part of his power, and if he refuses, submit still to be his slaves Is this the dectrine of " the Deliverer"? Is the the way in which he would reform the institutions of oppressed nations? Or, if an oppressed people should wrest a liberal constitution from their king without disturbing the tranquis lity of other states, what right have they to interfere? By what right do kings band together to prevent the dawn of light and liberty throughout all Europe ? Is it thus that Alexander expects to deserve the title of " Deliverer," and friend of the human race ?"-But the vizor has fallen off-and the Autocrat of all the Russians now stands in his true colors before us. Though farthest removed from the scene of the
