The Governor's Message—The plain common sense Message of Governor Burton, transmitted according to established usage to both Houses of the Legislature on Tuesday last, will be found in our columns of to-day.

On Wednesday last, Hucins G. Burton was re-elected Governor of this State; John Haywood, Public Treasurer; William Hill, Secretary of State; and Joseph Hutchins, Comptroller—all without opposition.

The Supreme Court met in this city on Monday last.

South Carolina.—A meeting of the Members of both branches of the Legislature of South Carolina was held on the 19th instant, when Jacob B. Coe, President of the Senate, was called to the Chair, and Robert Anderson, Clerk of the House of Representatives, appointed Secretary.

Georgia.—The resolution, recommending Gen. Andrew Jackson to the people of the United States, as a candidate for the Presidency, has passed both branches of the Legislature of Georgia—the Senate unanimously, and the H. of R. by a vote of 110 to 9.

Resolutions have been adopted by the Legislature of South Carolina, by an almost unanimous vote in both Houses, appropriating the sum of ten thousand dollars of six per cent. stock, redeemable in the year 1850, to the legal representatives of the late Thomas Jefferson, for the benefit of his heirs.

John M'Kinley has been elected a Senator to Congress from Alabama, vice Mr. Pickens, declined, by a majority of 5 votes over Clement C. Clay.

The appointment of Wm. Beach Lawrence, as Secretary of Legation to Great Britain, has been confirmed by the Senate of the U. States.
