ARTICLE V.—Section 1. Upon the demand of any three States legally assembled in their several conventions, the Congress shall summon a Convention of all the States...

2. All debts contracted and engagements entered into before the adoption of this Constitution shall remain in force...

3. This Constitution, and the laws of the Confederate States, made in pursuance thereof, and all treaties made, or which shall be made, under the authority of the Confederate States...
