refpetipe diftricts, may make a further allowance ; protided, that the compenfation does not exceed one dollar for erery 50 perions returned.
The uufinefs mask clofe on or before the firt day of May next, and the feveral a Miflants are by that time to tranfmit to me accurate returns of the perrons within their refpective divifions, according to the form prefcribed in the faid aet of Congrefs.
It will be expered tiant thofe who apply for appointinents farll exhibit recommendations from the principal and belt known charaters in their refpeaive counties, exprefine of their in:egrity, panauality, and finefs for the bufinefs.
