On the 18th and 19th of September next, at Halifax, for the purpole of appointing additions for the district of Halifax.

On the 231 and 24th at Hillfbo-" rough, for the district of Hillsboreugh.

On the 28th and 29th at Salibury, for the districts of Salibury and Morgan.

On the 3d and 4th of October next, at Fayetteville, for the dittrict of Fayetteville.

On the 8th and 9th of October, at Wilmington, for the diffrict of Wilmington.
