Foreign Intelligence.

L O N D O N, June 22.

ON Friday last an express arrived
from Paris, with advice of a to-
tal change of measures having taken
place in the French cabinet, that the
Ministers of France were entirely
changed, that the parliament were
called, and that the Duke de Chatelet,
formerly ambassador to our court, is
appointed minister, all which regula-
tions are so well relished by the people
as to have already given every appear-
ance of returning tranquility and
peace.

The French, in compliment to their
allies the States of America, have just
launched at Brest a new 74 gun ship,
called the America.

July 2. Yesterday morning goods
to the amount of upwards of 140,000l.
were entered in the Custom-House for
Virginia and Maryland.
