The forg of the three Govern, ments which the Chief Conful has given to Fiednont, to the Milanefe, and to the flate of Genos, throw slight on his political views but it is not the leaft remarkable circum ftance, that the men whom he has placed at the head of every one of them, are all three Generals It is only men of that profeffion who ere now promoted ty the French government to high offices.

The fecte of the $24^{\text {th }} \mathrm{Ju}!\mathrm{y}$, denominated this year the Fere dela Concorde, bas been cel:brated at Paris with all the pomp which the polerty of the Capital and the low ftate of the arrs would permit. Several thoufand Emigrants were, it is mentioned, on the pictording evening fluck out of the lif. A way of thankigivisg for the victories of the liepublic, and for the re.eltablifiment of Peace in Chureh and ttate, and on the following day a fervice was to be perfurmed in bonour of general Deflaix and captain Latour d Auvergue. Thus does the Chief Conlul affect at the fame moinent the clemency of Au. gultus, and the devotion of Ctomwell.
