数数数数 H E R E A S great Quantities of Paper Bills of Credit have 尊級一級尊 been created and issued in His W W fuch Bills of Credit to be legal Tender in Payments of Money: And whereas fuch Bills of Credit have greatly depreciated in their Value, .by Means whereof Debts have been discharged with a much less Value than was contracted for, to the great Discouragement and Prejudice of the Trade and Commerce of his Majefty's Subjects, by occasioning Confusion in Dealings, and lessening Credit in the said Colonies or Plantations: For Remedy whereof, May it please Your most Excellent Majesty, that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majerty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiricual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the First Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty four, no Act, Order, Refolution, or Vote of Assembly, in any of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America,

An ACT to prevent Paper Bills of Credit, shall be made, for creating or issuing any Paper Bills, or Bills of Credit of any Kind or Denomination whatfoever, declaring such Paper Bills, or Bills of Credit, to be legal Tender in Payment of any Bargains, Contracts, Debts, Dues, or Demands whatfoever; and every Clause or Provision which shall hereafter be inserted in any Act, Order, Resolution, or Vote of Assembly, contrary to this Act, shall be null and void.

And whereas the great Quantities of Paper Bills, or Bills of Credit, which are now actu-Majesty's Colonies or Planta- ally in Circulation and Currency in several tions in America, by Virtue Colonies or Plantations in America, emitted in of Acts, Orders, Resolutions, pursuance of Acts of Assembly declaring such or Votes of Assembly, making and declaring. Bills a legal Tender, make it highly expedient that the Conditions and Terms, upon which fuch Bills have been emitted, should not be varied or prolonged, fo as to continue the legal Tender thereof beyond the Terms respectively fixed by fuch Acts for calling in and difcharging fuch Bills; be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That every Act, Order, Resolution, or Vote of Assembly, in any of the said Colonies, or Plantations, which shall be made to prolong the legal Tender of any Paper Bills, or Bills of Credit, which are now subsisting and current in any of the faid Colonies or Plantations in America, beyond the Times fixed for the calling in, finking, and discharging of such Paper Bills, or Bills of Credit, shall be null and void.

> And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Governor or Commanin Chief for the Time being, in all or any of the fild Colonies or Plantations, shall, from and after the faid First Day of Septemper, One
