The fecond was during the repertion ut Scotland.

DUBLIN, May 21. A Special comminion, it is faid, will be thorely appointed for the trial of Lord Elward Fitzgerald. The weapon with which his Lordship did to much machief is of a curious construction. In the middle is a handle, with a bladeright and lett, which cut and thrults-of course it cuts whether drawn to the right or left. It is learnely politice to differe a min of fuch a weapon, without depriving him of lite.

May 22 .- This City has all this day been in extreme agitation. In confequence of a letter addressed to the Lord Whyar by the Secretary, Lord Cafflereagh, afferting that Government had received politive in-Estmation of an intended rifing of the Peo. ple, for the purpose of supverting the Government, &c. a general learen was made this morning, under the direction of the Magistrates, by the corps of Yeomanry, when a few pikes were collected, and lodged in the Ordnance Stores. The fearch is fill going forward.

Many persons on whom suspected arms, fuch as pikes, daggers, &c. &c. were not found, have indergone severe flageliations, &c. This discipline has not led to any discoveries; the Royal Exchange has been the place where punishments have
