THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THIS STATE,

FOR carrying into effect an act of Congress to provide for the valuation of lands and dwelling houses, and the enumeration of flaves, deem it adviscable, as the affestors will shortly commence their duties, to publish the following forms of lists for the information of the citizens of the said state, in order that they may have their lists ready prepared to deliver to the affestors, which will great.

y facilitate the buinefs.

The first lift to confist of every dwelling house, with the out-houses thereto appurtenant, and the lot of land on which they stand, not exceeding two acres in any case, which lift must specify in respect to dwelling houses, their fituations, dimensions or area, their number of stories, their number and dimensions of the windows, of what built, whether wood, brick or stone. By out-houses appurtenant are to be understood, kitchen, wash house, wood-house, meat-house, dairy, soach or carriage-house, brew-house, and bake-house, if for family use, and generally all baildings connected with the economy of house-keeping only, and not for the parpole of carrying on any professional business, trade or mechanic art, ter to promote hufbandry, and confequently to bring in revenue to the occupant; anless buildings of the latter description should be so situated on lots that they cannot be separated from the dwelling house, without injuring the value, in which safe, as they are not to escape valuation, they must go with the dwelling house; and though the lot to be valued with the dwelling house and appartenances, must in no cafe exceed two acres, yet it need not contain more than the ground on which the dwelling house and appurtenant buildings are actually erected, and what may be convenient for the ocupancy of the fame; and notwirhttanding a part of a dwelling house may be used for a store, sup or manufactory, yet the primary object of the building is to be regarded, and the building valued entire as a dwellingboule.

In the fecond lift are to be comprised all lands and town lots, (except lots on which dwelling houses, &c. are erected) all wharves, stores, ware houses, shops, effices, distributies, breweries, and bakeries, if carried on as an occupation; also mills, storges, furnaces, or other iron works, and generally all such buildings as are used tor the purpose of carrying on any protessional business, trade or mechanic art, or to promote husbandry; and contequently all barns, stables, &c. on farms, are to be estimated as belonging to this class; also unfinished buildings, shough intended for dwelling houses, are to be valued in the situation they were

in on the first day of October lait.

In the third lift there can be no difficulty, as it comprehends all flaves above

the age of twelve, and under the age of fitty years.

It is provided by the before recited act, that no part of faid tax shall be affelfed upon fuch lands, dwelling houses, or slaves, as at the time of passing the law,

were especially exempted from taxation by the laws of this flate.

And in order that the citizens may be particular in making out their lifts, it may not be amile to observe to them, that the airsh section of the before recited act says, that if any person shall deliver or disclose to any affestor, any salie or fraudulent lift, with intent to evade the valuation or enumeration hereby intended to be made, such person so offending, and being thereof convicted, before any sourt having competent jurisdiction, shall be fined in a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, nor less than one hundred dollars, at the difference of the court, and thall pay all costs and charges of prosecution.

The law further fays, that if any perion after being required or notified by an affelfor, to give in his, her or their lifts, and refuling and neglecting to to do, within ten days after such notification, thall torfeit and pay one hundred dollars,

with cost of fuit.

In these lists you must designate the state, county, parish or town, as the case may be, where the property lies, making separate lists aforesaid, of the property in each assessment district, it known, but it that is not known to the party making the list or return, as accurate an account of the place where the property lies, as in his, her, or their power, must be exhibited. In the lists aforesaid, reference must be had to the first day of October last.
