GREENSBORO, N. C.—John Temple Graves, II, of Atlanta, Ga., Famous editor, author and lecturer, will deliver the commencement address at A. and T. College on Monday, June 7 at 6:30 P. M. and Wm. Lloyd Jones of New York City, noted pulpitist and author, will deliver the baccalaureate address on Sunday afternoon at 4:00 o'clock. Both exercises will be held in the College Gymnasium.

Mr. Graves is a native of Rome Georgia and holds the degree of A. B. from Princeton University and M. A. from George Washington University. He was admitted to the bar in 1920 and since that time he has been in the public eye, lecturing and serving on the editorial staffs of some of the leading periodicals in the country.

Dr. Jones was born in Memphis, Tennessee, receiving both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Fisk University, located at Nashville. Later he earned his B. S. degree from the Union Theological Seminary and a second master's degree from Columbia University.

His reputation as a pulpitier puts him in the front ranks of the men of the race and he has made very valuable written contributions, among them his work as a co-editor of "What I Believe."

At present he is pastor of the St. James Presbyterian Church of New York City, boasts of a membership and seating capacity of 1,000 and six distinct and separate choirs. Every department of his church has been kept up to the highest standards and for "Distinguished Service on Race Relations" he was given an award by the New York Presbytery in 1933.

Other features of its commencement exercises at A. and T. College will be a musicale by the vocal groups, class day exercises and the annual Alumni Meeting and Luncheon. This year there will be the largest graduating class in history.

TENNESSEE LEGISLATURE APPROVES SCHOLARSHIPS

NASHVILLE, Tenn., May 13, —A bill providing for the payment of scholarships to Negro students for out-of-state study in subjects which they cannot secure in Tennessee because of prejudice has been approved in advance by Governor Gordon H. Browning and is scheduled to pass the legislature Saturday, May 8.

The Tennessee scholarship bill the direct result of the law suit pressed by the NAACP against the University of Tenn. In behalf of William B. Redmon, II. The lower court ruled against Redmon's action, to force the university to admit him to its school of pharmacy and this week the court overruled a motion for a re-hearing without hearing any argument.

The scholarship bill is not the best one of its kind but is not a bad bill and will provide Negro students who wish to do graduate and professional study much more opportunity than they have had heretofore. The Tennessee scholarship bill is the fourth such bill passed by Southern state legislatures since the NAACP began its campaign against educational inequalities. The states which have passed such bills are: Virginia, Kentucky, Oklahoma and Tennessee.

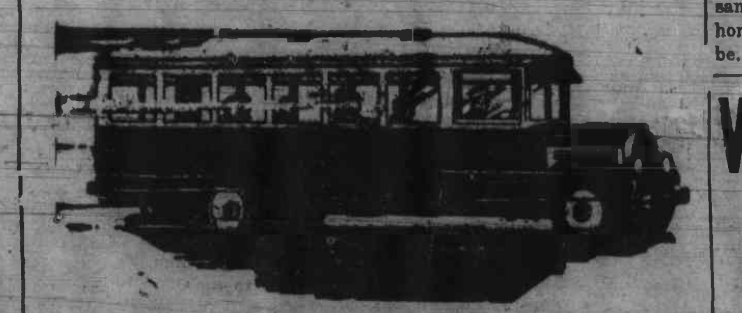
