

FUNDS ASKED FOR RECREATION CENTER

Appeal Made Over Radio Station WPTF

RALEIGH—An appeal for funds to be used to equip, furnish, and heat the new Negro recreation and training center recently erected by the Works Progress Administration in Smithfield, N. C., was broadcast over station WPTF, here last week by W. R. Collins, president of the Johnson County Negro Community League, under the auspices of the North Carolina WPA.

Mr. Collins explained that although the two buildings comprising the center were dedicated on April 18, they are as yet without equipment, which must be furnished by the League as project sponsor. Chiefly needed are a central heating plant to serve both buildings, furniture, and additional funds with which to supplement State and Federal grants to pay the salaries of additional teachers and to purchase books for a community library.

The center is designed principally for a program of directed recreational activities for Negro youth and adults. Mr. Collins said. In addition, one of its buildings—the Health and Recreation Hall will be used as a countywide meeting place for Negro farmers for homemaking exhibitions and for a program of training designed to reach the pre-school child.

The second building—Opportunity Hall—will offer opportunities for training in light mechanics, brick masonry, plastering, blacksmithing, cabinet making, painting, upholstery, shoe-making and printing for boys and men, and cooking, sewing, designing, home beautifying, and other household arts for girls and women.

Additional space is provided in this hall for a county wide canning room, a model home for practical demonstrations in home making, an exhibit hall, a room

designed for clinical purposes as a part of the health program for the school children of the county, and office space for the Negro County farm Agent and Negro County Home Demonstration Agent.

The total amount necessary to properly equip the buildings is \$19,013.50, Mr. Collins estimated.

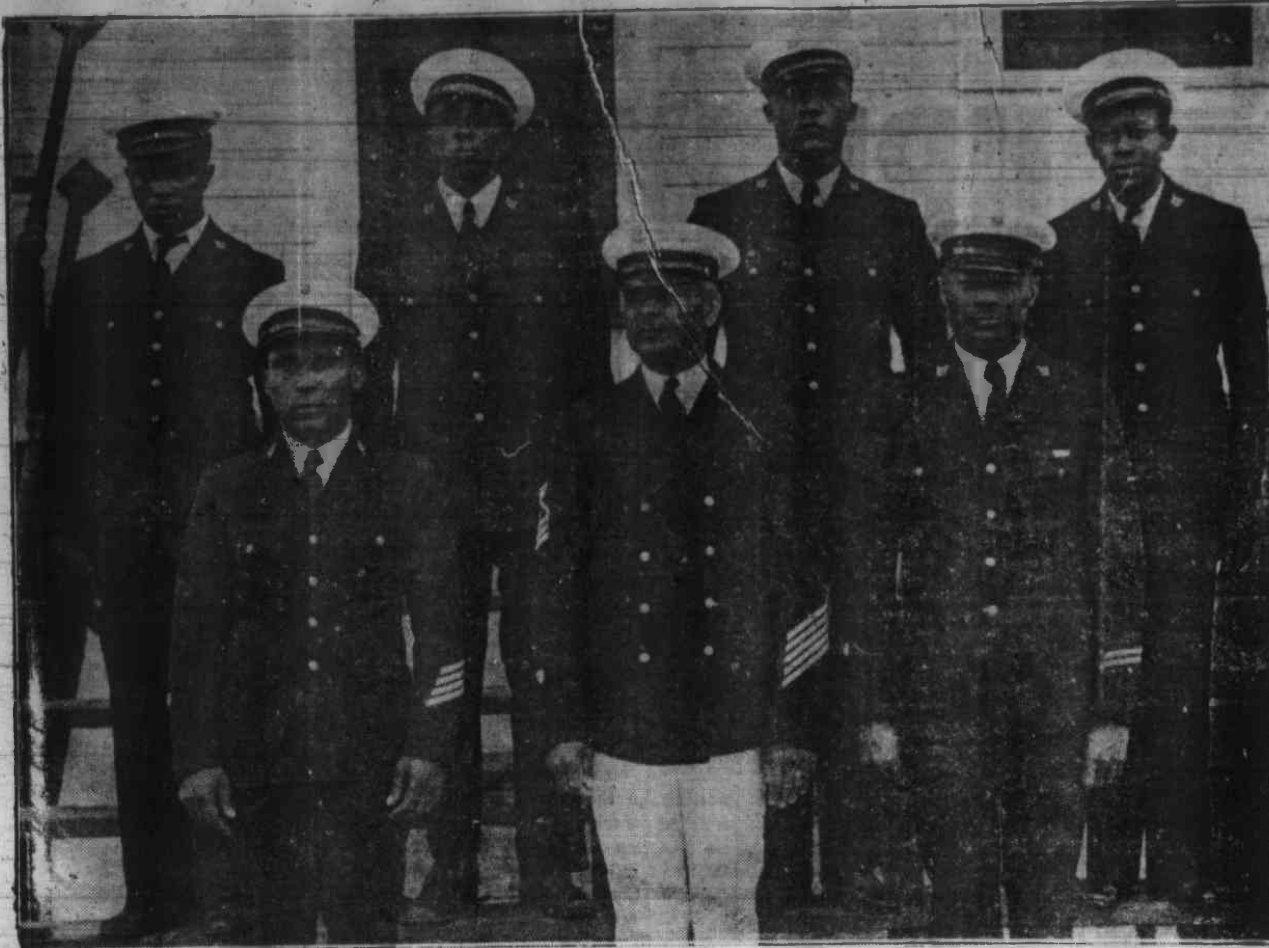
"The Negroes of Johnson County any program designed to improve the health conditions of youth and to provide safeguards against all health hazards," he said. "We are already cooperating with the WPA in a directed recreation program which has considerably reduced the number of cases involving Negro youth in the courts of Johnson County."

"We are not ready to connect the practical application of honest labor with the development of boys and girls for the future in Johnston County, to the end that their preparation will place them in demand for preferred service. And we are ready to give to the great service to the great class of forgotten girls and boys who enter and leave school without finishing, discouraged and lost in a world of excitement, in order that their training they receive will fit them for a type of profitable adjustment to the activities to be found in their home community as they enter upon the task of making a living."
