# Negroes Top Lists Of Va. Civil Service

Urban League Gave Courses

NEW YORK CITY, N. Y., Aug. 17.—Negroes outdistanced competing white in merit examinations and placed high on the lists of the Virginia State Employment Service which have just been published, according to information received today by the National Urban League, which is keeping constantly in touch with the Civil Service status of Negroes throughout the country. A study of the examination ratings listed by the Virginia Employment Service under the several job classifications reveals that nearly every other person on every list is a Negro, and on one list the first ten are Negroes.

On the Senior Interviewer list a Negro woman stands third, and a Negro man stands first in place for Field Supervisor, and second in place for Assistant Director.

The examination were held in the examinations were held efforts of the National Urban League and its local organization, the Richmond Urban League, of which Mr. Wiley A. Hall is the Executive Secretary, qualified Negroes in the city and state were urged to file and take the examinations. # Plan To Equalize Teachers' Pay In Alabama

NAACP Will Undertake Case If Mobile Teachers Have Courage To Serve As Test Subjects

Mobile, Ala., August 26.—(By E. M. Gooch for AP.) Transcending in interest all other work to be undertaken by the Regional Conference of Southern Branches of the NAACP is the proposed fight to equalize teachers' salaries in the deep South, the first of such cases being planned for Mobile County, Ala., where colored teachers are poorly underpaid, and with many receiving less than fifty per cent of the minimum pay for white teachers. A recent investigation conducted by the Mobile Branch of the NAACP revealed that several high school and elementary teachers who are college graduates receive as low as \$28 per month salary.

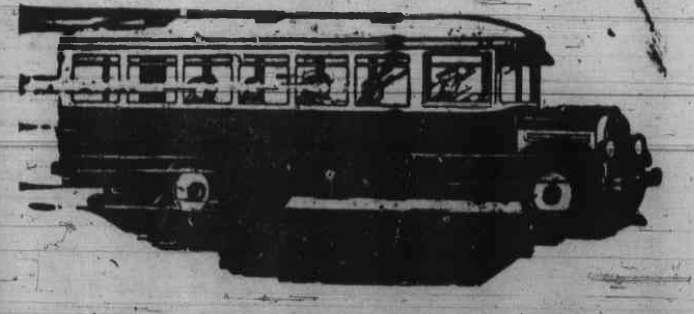
