season is to get at the forces contributing to it. The forces making definite contributions to the present depression he listed as:

the accumulation of inventory in the stock market, the contraction of credit (caused by the selling of investments reserves), the narrowing of profit margins by increased wages and high prices of building supplies, inadequate supply of durable investment funds and the lack of confidence in regard to hope for profit from investments. The latter has been caused by the inflation mind-set of capitalists, reduction of output by labor through strikes, taxation by the government and mainly class hatred which has

been continuously fanned by politicians.
