

Communist Party Holds Its Convention In Greensboro

On Sunday, May 15, the Communist Party held its State Convention in Greensboro. There were over thirty elected delegates, of whom close to one third were Negroes. The past work of the Party was reviewed, and progress noted as compared with the past. In view of the present critical world situation, and the economic depression and political situation in this country and in North Carolina in particular, the delegates were far from satisfied.

Redoubled efforts were demanded in the future for the following objects: 1. The greatest support of all progressive and pre-New Deal candidates for offices in the coming primaries, as against reactionaries or those uncommitted to a program. Defense of the Negro's right to vote wherever this is challenged. The urging of all Negroes to vote.

2. Redoubled aid for the sufferers in Spain and China, for the boycott of Japanese goods,

lifting of the arms embargo on loyalist Spain so that the people of Spain may have the means of defending themselves; placing an embargo against Germany and Italy, who buy munitions from us and transport them to France; increased propaganda for a concerted action by this country together with the Soviet Union and the other democratic countries to halt the fascist aggressor nations in their drive to a world war.

TRUE STORIES PROGRESS THROUGH CHEMISTRY

Transparent Films From Forest and Field

Of the many products made by the chemist using cellulose as a raw material, none has had a more rapid or sensational history than transparent cellulose film, best known by the trade name "Cellulose." Invented around 1908 by Bradenberger, a Swiss chemist working in France, and first used chiefly in making women's hats, this material is now used for literally hundreds of different purposes. Although first made in this country in 1924, the growth of transparent cellulose film has increased so rapidly that during the past five years a sufficient amount of this material has been made to encase the earth around the equator with a band over two hundred feet wide.



Transparent cellulose film and rayon are true sisters, both being derived because this moisture-proof film preserved them. Meats appeared in this new wrapper, thus insuring freshness and cleanliness. The use of moisture-proof cellulose film spread to fruits and other perishable foods, until today the average grocery store contains dozens of products kept fresh by it. It is generally conceded today that this transparent film is an aid to public health since foodstuffs, textiles, and other items wrapped in it are not readily contaminated with disease germs.

In addition to its use for wrapping all kinds of articles, transparent cellulose film is used for many other purposes. In the form of narrow ribbons it is woven into attractive fabric for curtains. Fifty thousand yards of sparkling cellulose film were used to make the moonbeams in the motion picture presentation of "A Mid-Summer Night's Dream." In the theater it has been used for costumes. In the radio world for making sound effects, by surgeons as an outside dressing so that the progress of wounds might be observed, and on the farm as a cover for early plants to protect them from sudden changes in the weather. It would seem, in fact, that the usefulness of this sparkling transparent film as a decorative and protective material is limited only by the imagination of the user.
