D. C. School Not Discussed At Baptist Confab

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19th. (CNS)--The National Training School for Women and girls in Washington, D. C. of which Miss Nannie H. Burroughs is the President, seems to have "got the double cross" at the recent annual meeting of the National Baptist Convention, Sept. 7-11 in St. Louis, Missouri.
The long discussed "Relationship of the Training School to the National Baptist Convention" attracted large delegations from every section of the country, and it was apparent that they came prepared to pass upon the recent proposal of the Board of Directors of the National Baptist Convention to withdraw all connections, allegiance and support from the institution.
Notwithstanding this drastic and sensational proposal, the convention was never allowed to pass upon the resolution or even the subject in open meeting.
The School "got the double cross" when Mrs. B. W. Layton of Philadelphia, Penn. President of the Woman's Convention, brought the subject before the delegates, in her annual message and refused to allow them to consider the question on the floor of the convention.
