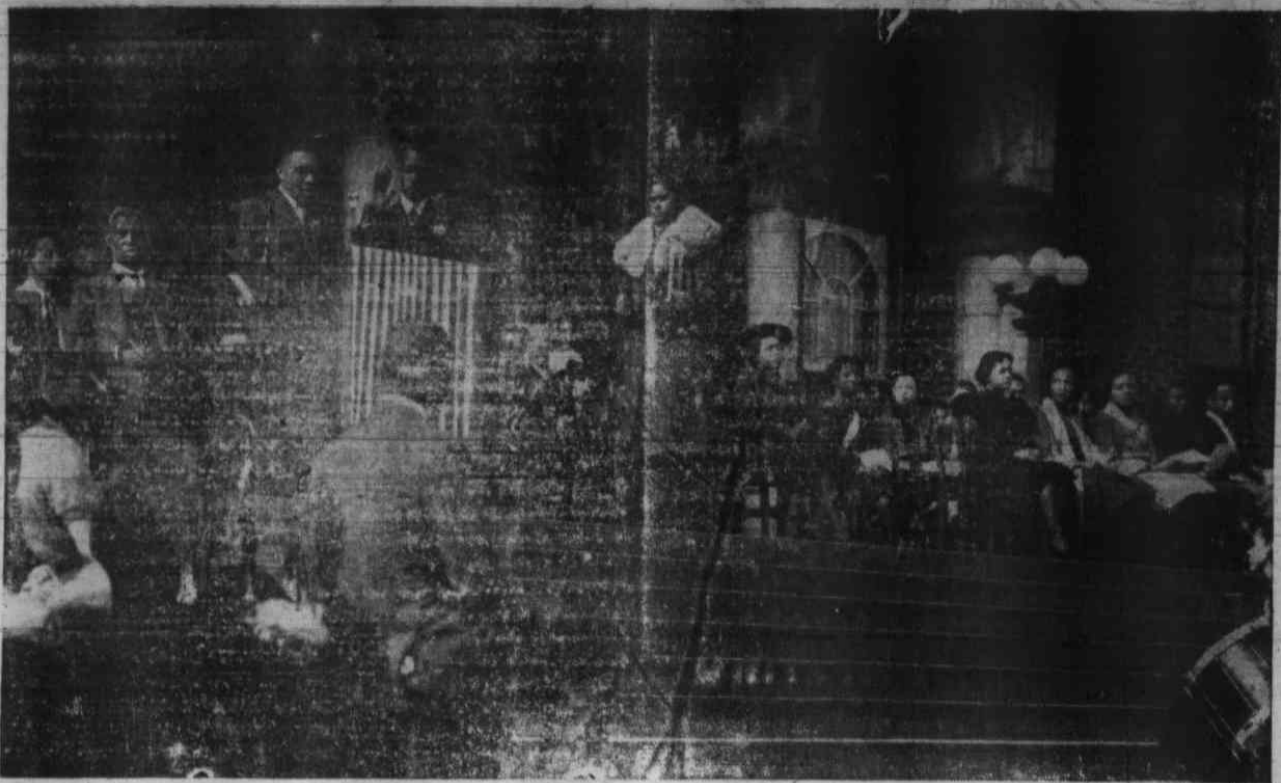

NEW YORK, January 20th.—Plans are well under way for celebrating the thirtieth anniversary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Saturday, Feb. 11, with a nationwide series of dances in the large cities throughout the country officials of that organization announced here today.

The key dance of the series will be held in New York City at the 369th Regiment armory.

## Favors Speedy Enactment Of Federal Law

NEW YORK, January 20.—The statement of Mrs. Franklin Roosevelt that she favored speedy enactment of a federal anti lynching bill was hailed today by officials of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored.

Mrs. Roosevelt has been known to be against lynching, but until her speech before the National Conference on Negro Youth in Washington January 12, she had made no announcement of her belief in a federal anti-lynching law.

(The Gavagan federal anti-lynching has been introduced in the House along with several other similar bills, and the Wagner Van Nuys Capper bill has been introduced in the Senate.)

NAACP officials cited Mrs. Roosevelt's assertion that a remedy for the Negro problem "lies in better organization and in organizations which know no color line." The NAACP has been interracial since it was founded thirty years ago and has been seeking better organization among Negroes ever since it was started.

For many years the NAACP

has been condemned in some circles because it has been called "an agitator" which provoked and protested again on the plight of the Negro minority. The First Lady in her January 12 talk said the Negro must use patience and good judgment in fighting for his rights, but added:

"I think it is harmful everywhere for minorities to remain silent when minorities do not enjoy all the rights of a democracy."

Mrs. Roosevelt emphasized that she was speaking as an individual and not for the Administration. Her straightforward endorsement of a federal anti-lynching bill recalled her sharp exchange of remarks last Nov. in Birmingham, Ala. with Congressman Luther Patrick of that state over his opposition to a federal anti-lynching law. Some observers are inclined to believe that Mrs. Roosevelt has been brought to her present state of mind not so much by arguments from Negroes as by the actions of certain types of southern white people themselves.

## Okla. Makes Gesture Toward Better College

OKLAHOMA CITY, January 20.—In a move that is regarded as a weak gesture, that will not stand up in view of the clear-cut language of the recent supreme court decision opening up the law school of the University of Missouri to Negro citizens, the State of Oklahoma put into its legislative hopper a bill designed to equalize graduate training opportunity for colored citizens with those of white.

The bill which was introduced

on the opening day of the state legislature by State Representative Creekmore, of Wallace City, states "the purpose of this Act is to provide a plan for complete separation of the races in the preparatory schools and institutions of higher learning of the State of Oklahoma."

The bill provides that the Colored Agricultural and Normal University be changed to "Colored University of Oklahoma," and that facilities in the institution for Negro citizens should be equal to those of whites in the state.

The revealing sentence in the bill, which shows it works to state that these equal facilities shall obtain for both races, taking into consideration the number of students enrolled in such course of study at said institution.

Although the bill directs the establishment of schools of law, medicine and other professional schools no amount is set aside for this work.
