## Eight Doctors Battle

DETROIT, Mich .--- Henry Bus ter Payton, 80, of 145 North Fordinand avenue, was the ob-ject of a mirace heart operation Sturday night at Receiving hos-pital as . a staff of doet ors and | several nurses restorted his fast obbing life, after an hour of delicate surgical work,

Stabbed through the heart by ne Howard McCutcheon whose sister Payton is alleged to have alapsed, at the hospital, the victim was given an intravenous saline solution, prior to being taken to the operating room where eight doctors and three nurses made a successful cffort to save his life.

It was reported that four doctors worked on his heart, two worked to prevent his lungs from collapsing and two more siving him blood transfurions. Several of his ribs were removed so that six stitches could be taken in the left auricle of his heart.

Payton's recovery was such that he was able to identify Howard McCutcheon and his sister as his assailants.

Dectors stated that Payton lest three quarts of blood during the operation and was given we quarts by transfusion. He will be kept in an oxygen tent for several days. Doctor Charles Johnson is director of surgery at Receiving hospital and is credited with the successful oferation according to reports.

Hospital attaches report that Payton will live "if no infection set in."


