Eight Doctors Battle

DETROIT, Mich.—Henry Buster Payton, 30, of 145 North Ferdinand avenue, was the object of a miracle heart operation Saturday night at Receiving hospital as a staff of doctors and several nurses restored his fast ebbing life, after an hour of delicate surgical work.

Stabbed through the heart by one Howard McCutcheon whose sister Payton is alleged to have slapped at the hospital, the victim was given an intravenous saline solution, prior to being taken to the operating room where eight doctors and three nurses made a successful effort to save his life.

It was reported that four doctors worked on his heart, two worked to prevent his lungs from collapsing and two were giving him blood transfusions. Several of his ribs were removed so that six stitches could be taken in the left auricle of his heart.

Payton's recovery was such that he was able to identify Howard McCutcheon and his sister as his assailants.

Doctors stated that Payton lost three quarts of blood during the operation and was given two quarts by transfusion. He will be kept in an oxygen tent for several days. Doctor Charles Johnson is director of surgery at Receiving hospital and is credited with the successful operation according to reports.

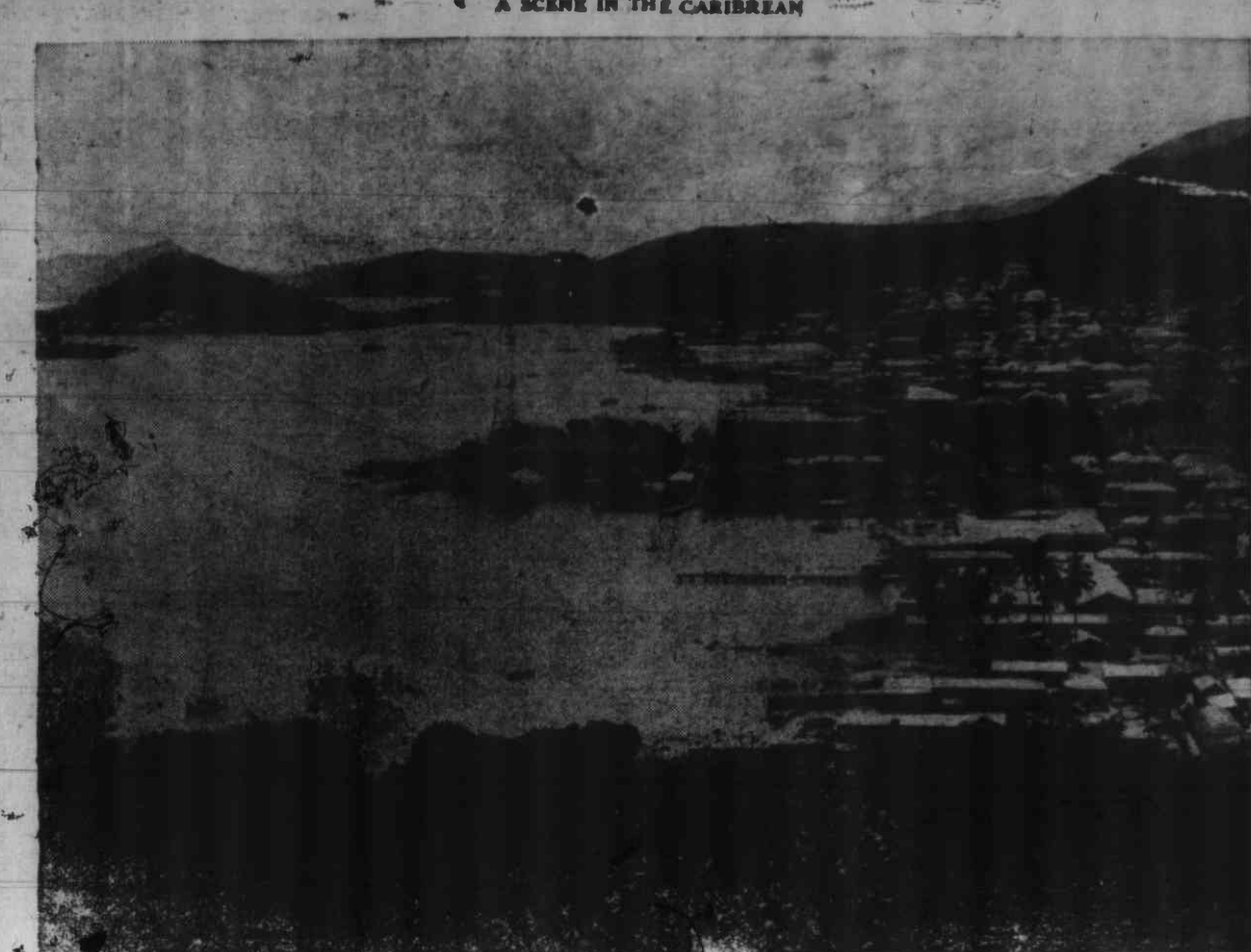
Hospital attaches report that Payton will live "if no infection set in."

EASTER SERVICES HELD AT SAINT MATTHEW CHURCH; BISHOP RUSSELL SPEAKS

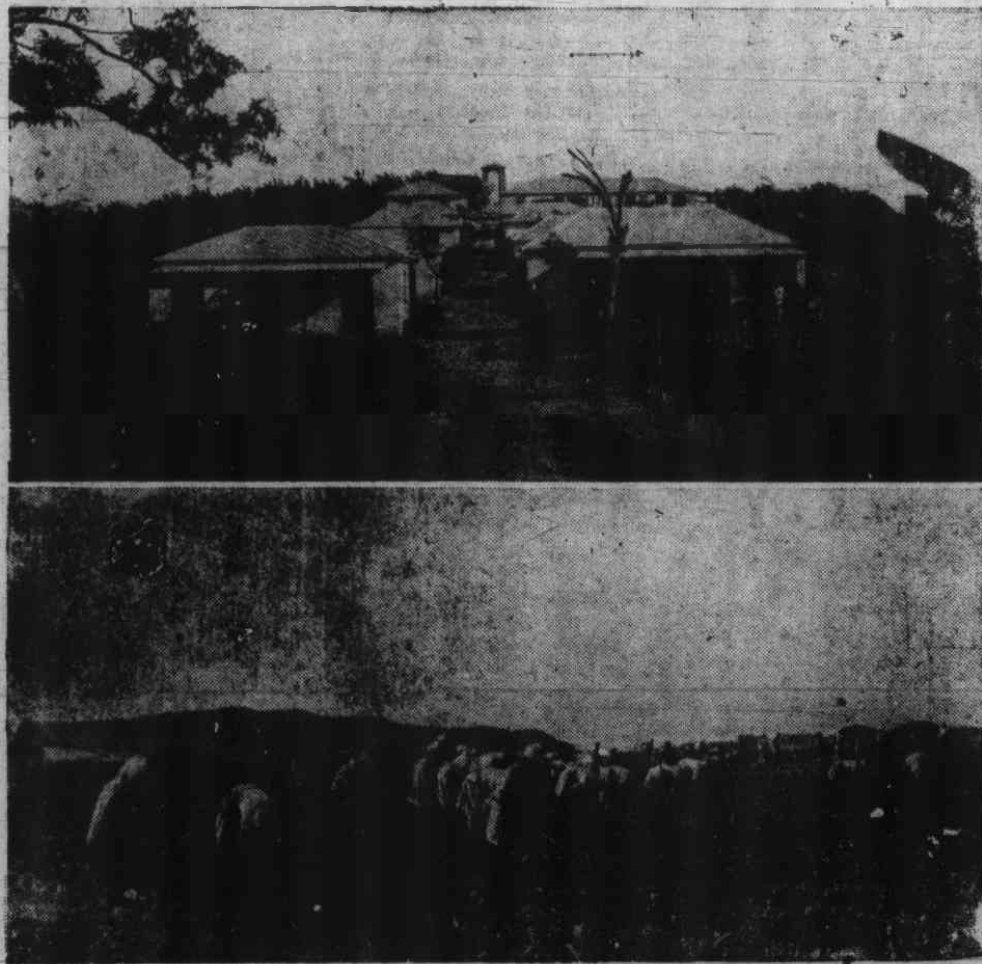
