

Bank clearings are known to be an excellent barometer of general business conditions," and while there are as yet no lief those which as the financial senter of the Carolinas is grow ing in importance.

Clearings thus far this year indicate that it will be the biggest year in the history of the Clearing Hous Association. For the first seven month of the year, the clearings have totaled \$486,996;000 which is \$70,516,600 over the total of the corresponding periods of 1938. The 1938 clearings were \$103,036;500 less than the total for 1937 which means that it will be necessary now to gain only about thirty million dollars during the remaining five monthe of the year to exceed the record of 1987.
