### FRAME-UP OF GEORGIA ATTORNEY COLLAPSES

BIRMINGHAM, (CNA)—An attempt to frame Arthur D. Shores race attorney active in the fight for the right of members of his race to vote, collapsed here this week.

Shores was acquitted in Police Court by City Judge Martin charges of disorderly conduct brought against him following an outbreak in connection with his prosecution of a white policeman for beating a youth.

The police officer, George Williams had beaten Will Hall a prisoner with a rubber hose. Charges of brutality were brought against him before the Civil Service Board and Shores represented hall.

As Shores left the hearing, Monroe Conner Negro police informer leaped upon him from behind. W. H. Hillins, Shores' partner and G. H. Lucas jumped in and pulled Conner off the young attorney.

All four were arrested by the police, who were naturally handsomely charged with disorderly conduct.

# Charlotte Church Has Great Record Of Progress, Service

MAKES PROGRESS

CHARLOTTE, N. C.—Friendship Baptist Church, located on the corner of First and Bevard Streets here has for forty eight years been a center of first rate influence and during the past seven years of the pastorate of Rev. J. L. Powell the present incumbent has made great progress in all departments.

Rev. Powell is graduate of the College and Theological Departments of Johnson C. Smith University here from which he holds the A. B. and B. D. degrees. He is a native of McKeesport, Pennsylvania and this is his first charge.

The Friendship Baptist church has been pastored by some of the most outstanding men in the country, among them Dr. G. O. Bullock who is now a trustee of Shaw University and pastor of one of the largest churches in the nation's capital; Dr. G. W. Watkins head of the ministerial training division of the extension department of Shaw University and a prominent Norfolk, Virginia pastor; Rev. C. C. Adams now pastoring in Philadelphia and Rev. B. K. Mason now pastoring in Gastonia.

Rev. Powell has placed much emphasis on the younger members of his flock and a very active Junior Church has been started during his pastorate. Mrs. B. H. Peris is supervisor of the Junior Church and Rev. Powell preaches a sermonette to the younger members each Sunday morning before regular service.

Approximately one year ago Rev. Powell inaugurated an "Altar Service" which is an exclusive and original feature of Friendship Baptist Church. At this service all persons who are suffering physical, mental, financial or other troubles are aided in taking their troubles to God, and Rev. Powell reports that many of his members have been helped by this service. Not only does Rev. Powell pray that his members will secure jobs, but whenever one of his members becomes unemployed he goes out to help the person secure a job, and has been instrumental in securing many positions for needy members. One of the first things he did, Rev. Powell reveals when

he took over the pastorate of Friendship was to take a very active interest in the Sunday school, even to the extent of going out himself in his car and securing scholars among the less privileged neighborhoods. He reveals that he was so successful in this type of work that on a recent Christmas Mrs. R. A. Dunn wife of the President of the Commercial Bank donated a large sum of money to get useful Christmas gifts for a number of these "forgotten children."

The Sunday School now is one of the most valuable adjuncts to Friendship under the leadership of the pastor and Mr. Paul Stowe, supt.; Deacon John N. Hemphill—assistant supt. and Earnest McCrea secretary.

The deacon board which is so necessary to the functioning of any successful church is very strong at Friendship and is made up of Messrs. J. H. Hemphill, Samuel; Barnes; J. A. Crawford; Edward Gist; James Ford; Robert Jones; Kim Mickens and G. H. Richmond. Deacons include Messdames L. Walker, Lula Hemphill, Samuel Barnes, James Ford; James Crawford; Annie Hemphill; Kim Mickens and Nannie Williams. Trustees at Friendship are J. A. Crawford, chairman Z. Alexander; Sr. J. M. Hemphill; Staquy Dwiggins; Eugene Hunter; G. H. Richmond and Edward Gist. Friendship is very proud of its choir, led by Messrs. Stacy

Dwiggins chorister; G. H. Richmond supervisor and James Harris, organist. The smartly uniformed and extremely efficient Usher Board of Friendship Church is led by Messrs. James Ford, president; and Edward Gist vice president.

(Continued from page 3) objections of some of the officials of this organization. The committee that appeared before the AMA were members of the American Medical Association and accredited representatives of the National Medical Association; duly authorized by me to present certain grievances of NMA against AMA. Among these grievances were certain discriminatory practices against Negro physicians in the refusal of county societies to accept their membership purely on the ground of color; which refusal automatically made them ineligible to the AMA. The purpose of the special committee primarily was to the AMA four major propositions to wit:

1 The deletion of the word Col. from behind the names of Negro physicians in the American Medical Association directory.

2 Recognition of Negro physicians in the AMA.

3 Assurance of participation of Negro professionals in the various governmental projects.

4 Participation of Negro physicians in the scientific bene fits of organized medicine. "Regardless of what the accomplishments have been the committee has done a great service for the National Medical Association in a most heroic and manly fashion and as president of the National Medical Association, I wish to publicly acknowledge my appreciation of the service of this committee.

In his closing remarks before the senate committee, the president said, "The National Medical Association subscribes in principle to Senator Wagner's bill with reservations as stated.

The president in making this statement was actuated by his belief that while he knew the Wagner act and the National Health bill are two entirely different documents yet with the reservations that we had made, such a commitment was consistent with our belief that certain health benefits and health security which is so vitally and fundamentally needful to 13,000,000 Negroes could be more reasonably assured by federal provision than by any other known method.
