The telegram read:

"In the face of the present world crisis which faces America, the Chicago Baptist Ministers conference representing 250 Negro Baptist ministers and pastors and 110,000 communicants wishes to assure you of their earnest prayers that you may be guided of God as our leader. As Dr. L. K. Williams, president of the National Baptist convention, has already said-'we pray for peace' and urge that no, means be left untired to keep our country out of the tragedy of war.

American Negroes have always been loyal to this country, even though they have not al-ways shared in the democracy offered by America to others of its citizens. 'We are parsionately dedicated to the principle of democracy for all men regardless of race or creed. To this end we pledge our allegtance and cooperation in the great tasks of modern democracy."
