A & T COLLEGE OF GREENSBORO has the distinction of being the first North Carolina school to be host to the CIAA track and field championships. This almost national event takes place in the Memorial Stadium there Saturday. Attracting almost as much attention as the combined representatives of the 13 members college and Universities will be John Borican and John Woodruff who have consented to run the half mile exhibition. This will be much more than an exhibition, however. It will be the renewal of a bitter feud that has gone between these two for quite some time. It will also be their first meeting on and outdoor track.

BORICAN is remembered in the CIAA as Virginia State's one-man track team. Since his graduation he has studied art at Columbia University.

WOODRUFF, former Olympic star and indispensable member of the University of Pittsburgh track team has been running for a club in New York since his graduation.

GENE HARRINGTON and his tennis racket are making their presence felt in the CIAA this season. Gene, Shaw University's freshman all-round athlete and pride of Hillside Park high school, has accounted for Shaw's being on the winning side in several intercollegiate matches this year and he waded through the best that the CIAA could offer in the men's singles at the tournament at Lincoln, Pa. last Saturday. He took them all in stride until he met his chief rival, Roland McDaniels, who is now a student at Union. After three sets, Gene was the loser. Durham is still proud of him.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT, May 15, is the night when the Durham Bulls and the fans of Durham are to observe "Chapple Jonson night." He is the colored trainer for the Bulls. A talk with President Fred Fleig of the Bulls reveals that "Johnson night" honors the trainer in name only. In reality, Johnson is promoting this night himself in the attempt to prove that Negroes will attend games at the park at low prices. The price of admission will be cut in half for this game and if sufficient interest is shown the price will be permanently reduced for colored. Mr. Fleig stated that he had thought that the number of Negro fans attending Piedmont league games here would have increased after a section was reserved for them in the grandstand. If interest is

Boxing Meet To Be Held 3 Days

GREENSBORO, N. C. — The Carolinas Negro Boxing Championships of the National Amateur Athletic union are to be held in Greensboro, Thurs, Fri. and Saturday, May 23, 24, and 25 according to an announcement from C. M. Palmer director of the Windsor Community Center here. This three day meet is open to any amateur athlete in North or South Carolina and will be held at the Greensboro World War Memorial Stadium.

Contests will be held in the following classes: flyweight, bantamweight, featherweight, light weight, light heavyweight, and heavyweight.

All contestants are required to register as certified Amateur Athletes, and must be above 16. All entry blanks should be mailed to C. M. Palmer, Windsor Community Center, Greensboro, N. C. not later than Tuesday, May 21. Weighing in and physical examinations will begin at 2 p. m. Thursday, May 23, and the fights will begin at 7.

Gold and silver medals and championship certificates will be awarded to winners and runners up in each weight class; trophies will go to the winning team and the best all-round boxer of the tournament.
